Watch the video with "thank you in 31 languages" once without stopping it, then again with stopping after each one and repeating in a chorus. Go back to any that were difficult (by clicking the left arrow the video rewinds just enough to repeat one language). Check words for languages according to need.

When the group is quite comfortable pronouncing the words, choose as many cards as there are students plus yourself. Pick according to your needs for vocabulary and interests. You can pick a few extras if people get bored with the ones they have. Write the nationalities on the back side of the cards (use a pencil so it doesn't show from the front side). See cards below.

Put the following conversation (or something similar) on the board:

Blagodarya!	Blagodarya!
Is it Bulgarian?	• Is it Polish?
Yes it is.	 No, it isn't, it's Bulgarian.

Procedure of game:

Give everyone a card. Let them mingle, find pairs and play the short conversation twice (using both of their words). When a pair is done, they exchange cards and go on to find a new partner. Demonstrate with a student in an open pair before students stand up to mingle.

You may want to exchange some cards for fresh ones every now and then (when they reach you in the game) if you want more words to circulate than there are participants.
